
The ABC's Of Kindergarten

Everything about kindergarten





Attendance - A successful school experience is the responsibility of the child, the parents, and the school. Your child's progress, both academically and

the parents, and the school. Your child's progress, both academically and socially, is influenced to a great extent by daily participation. Regular attendance is critical.

Absences - Students need to be in school as much as possible. We are building language, working on auditory development, and using hands-on materials to enhance our learning. These activities cannot be duplicated for students who are missing. Excessive absences hinder a child's progress. If your child is going to be absent, please **email your child's teacher** and send a note on their return. Please try to plan family trips during our scheduled breaks.

Arrival - Instruction begins promptly at 8 am. School doors open at 7:45am. If you plan to have your child eat breakfast please plan to drop them off at 7:45 to make sure they have ample time to eat before heading to class. Students must be signed in by an adult if arriving after 8 A.M.



Birthdays - Birthdays are very important to children. On your child's birthday you have the option to send a treat for your child to share with their class at lunch.

Behavior- Behavior Management systems will be communicated by your child's teacher.

Bags - Kindergarteners will need a backpack and will have a locker to store belongings. Please make sure backpacks are not oversized or on wheels.



Clothing -

- SSA Standard School Attire (more details on the PTO website)
- Students must wear closed toe, rubber bottom shoes every day! No sandals or flip flops.
- Girls: Please wear shorts under skirts/dresses.
- Please send an extra change of clothes (including socks/underwear) to be kept at school with school supplies.

Conferences - Parent/Teacher Conferences will be held on October 31st.



Dismissal -

- Dismissal begins at 3 P.M.
- Car Riders: MUST put your nametag in the <u>driver's side window</u> for callers to see. **Stay in your car** teachers on duty will help your child find his/her car.
- Walkers: Dismissed at the front of the school. <u>Please bring your provided</u> nametag daily.
- Bus Riders will be escorted to the bus.
- PNA (aftercare program) attendees will be dismissed to the PNA teachers.
- Please notify your teacher of dismissal changes as early as possible! Unknown
 dismissal changes hold up the dismissal line at the end of the day. If you don't
 hear back from your teacher, call the office. We often can't email after our
 planning time. Writing the change on the date in the take home folder is a great
 way to inform us about a dismissal change.

You MUST use the tag provided by us. We will not release your child otherwise.



Early Dismissal - No early dismissals after 2:30 P.M.! Please email or send a note if possible.

Fine Motor – To help your child increase their fine motor skills, please practice opening/closing lunch materials, buttoning/unbuttoning, etc. This will help your child become more independent!

Field Trips- We will be taking field trips outside of the school this year. We plan to take 2-4 field trips and will communicate more information at a later date. **No siblings allowed on field trips for safety reasons.**

Folders – Folders need to be returned to school daily.



Good Behavior - We expect all children to follow our school and classroom rules.

Please reinforce these rules and expectations at home with your child (and help us teach the specific skill if applicable). If your child comes home with a report, please address at home (discuss, consequences, loss of privileges, etc.)



Homework -

You will receive a monthly homework sheet with different activities. These can be completed in any order at your own pace. An adult should initial each box, then a child can color it in. Return the completed sheet to school at the end of the month!


In addition to the monthly choice sheet your child will come home with sight words to practice. Please practice these at home regularly!



Illness - Please do not send your child to school if they are sick!

Students should be fever free for 24 hours without the use of medication.

Send an excuse/doctor's note once your child returns to school.

Job Opportunity – Coming to school to learn is your child's job! We will prepare them to be independent learners and citizens.

- Lunch (and breakfast) is free!

Laptops – Every child will be assigned a laptop. This laptop will be kept at school daily.




Messy - Kindergarten can be messy!

Paideia – a collaborative intellectual dialogue facilitated with open-ended questions about a text, meant to nurture proficiency in thinking, communication, and growth of social skills. School-wide and grade level projects. At least 1 Socratic seminar per quarter.

Phonics – Phonics is the teaching of letters and sounds to read and write. We will be taking a "sounds first" approach to phonics. This means your child will learn the sound each letter makes BEFORE they learn the name of the letter.

Parties – MNPS allows two officials parties. Kindergarten has chosen a Winter Celebration & End of Year Celebration.



Questions -

- Email is the best way to communicate with us during the school day.
- You can send a note in your child's daily folder.



Report Cards – Report cards are sent home after each 9 weeks

Progress Reports- are sent home in the middle of each 9 weeks.

Please review, sign, and return.

Recess – **4**0 minutes of activity. If it is raining, we will have indoor recess – centers, games, free choice, etc.



Supplies – Yes, we really do need ALL the items on the supply list!

- Personal water bottles are recommended. We ask that you send your child to school with a FILLED reusable water bottle. Only water please!
- Please practice opening/refilling independently at home, including twisting caps on and off!

Snacks- Kindergarten has an early lunch this year, so we will have an afternoon snack. Please send a snack with your child that they can open/eat independently. Please make sure you child is aware what is snack and what is for their lunch, so they don't eat both for lunch.



Transportation – Changes to your child's transportation must be received by note or email or they will be sent home by their usual method of transportation. You can also write this on the child's folder calendar.


**Emails sent the day of must be received by 11:30. If you don't hear back from your teacher, please call the office.
